Notes From the Development Office

All May tuition must be received by May 28th. As per the tuition agreement, all graduating 8th Graders must have all accounts paid in full by May 28 in order to graduate: Tuition, Before & After-care Payments, Share Basket & Tardy Fees. All other families have until June 4th to pay Before & Aftercare, Share Basket & Tardy Fees. Any delinquent accounts will hold report cards and participation in Field Day and jeopardize re-registration for 2010-1011.



June Payments

A white envelope for special fees due in June was sent home with your child on May 14th. This envelope contained the Fee Payment Plan, Tuition Agreement, Supply Forms, Snack Fee Envelope and Holy Childhood Mission Envelope. All monies and forms are due back by June 7th.

Delinquent Tardy Fees
